Due to location of school, near the beach, perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. b) Children will be given access to a range of healthy breakfast choices to set them up for the school day. c) Children become further skilled at skipping. Children new to the school learn skipping skills. d) Children are respectful of all cultures and gain a deeper understanding through dance. Opportunities for children to be active and learn to participate as part of a team. Improved attitude to health and fitness.
