School Menu Next week we will be on week 1 of our school menu 😊 Dear Parents and Carers,

We had a great day yesterday celebrating reading and World Book Day! Mrs O'Reilly, our English lead, organised a fun filled day. Kevin Price, the children's author, spent time with each class performing a storytelling session; year 6 children came to share a book with our children; we had costume competitions, opportunities to share favourite books and opportunities to complete reading activities in different classrooms around the school. My favourite part from this year, however, was seeing Preeya-Rose's Matilda themed menu being made by Mr Bines and the catering team. Let's hope we have helped to develop a joy in reading and enjoying books. Thank you for providing costumes for the children to wear – they all looked fantastic! And a big thank you to Mrs O'Reilly for organising the day – you did a great job!

Thank you to our year 1 parents who came along to our open morning. The focus for the session this time was phonics, with Mrs Tomaselli, our phonics lead, sharing with parents information and ideas as to how you can support your child at home. She also explained that all year 1 children across the country will be taking part in the phonics screening in June. This process assesses children's ability to identify sounds, blend them together and decode a range of real and pseudo words. Following Mrs Tomaselli's presentation, parents were invited to spend time in the year 1 classrooms taking part in phonic activities. The feedback we have had from parents has been very positive and the morning went very well. Thank you to our fantastic year 1 and phonics team, and to the parents that were able to attend. If you couldn't make it, please don't worry, you can catch up with your child's class teacher at a later date. Don't forget every Tuesday straight after school, in every class, we hold 'Open House' sessions – this could be another opportunity to find out more about the phonics screening check.

Miss Pargin and I met with Miss Harman-Page this week to discuss our forest school sessions. When talking to the children, they often tell me that forest schools days are their favourite days so I was a little upset to hear that some sessions have had to be conducted inside as the children haven't got suitable footwear in school. Please make sure your child has a pair of wellies that fit in school every day. Having our own forest is a fantastic resource and we are very lucky to be able to offer these exceptional learning opportunities, so please help us to ensure the children can make the most of these learning opportunities. If you have any old wellies at home that you no longer need, please send these into school as they can be used as spares. We have many spares from smaller sizes, but very little size 12 and above. Thank you in advance.

In response to the concerns parents share with me on an almost daily basis, we are excited to be officially launching our 3PR parking mission on Tuesday! Thank you to those of you who have already expressed an offer of support with the patrols. If you haven't yet sent your slip back, please do so. The scheme will only be successful if we have your support to run it with us. All children who walk, cycle and scoot through the zone at the front of the school will receive a token – as will children attending breakfast club and using the other gates.
