Dear Parents and Carers,

It will certainly bring a tear to your eye! We are all looking forward to welcoming the year 2 children back for a leavers' party one Friday after school in the autumn term, hopefully in September, where we can present you with your Burrsville bears and say a proper goodbye. I know some of the children (parents and staff too!) are feeling emotional about moving on to pastures new, but this is a time of excitement and new beginnings. I have spoken to many of the children and I know they have enjoyed their transition visits over the last few weeks. All staff wish each child the very best of luck and hope they settle well in their new school. We really hope they come and see us to keep us updated with their new experiences! Any hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back and any hair accessories should only be blue, black or white.
