Dear Parents and Carers,

We have reached the end of our first full week at school and I am delighted with how well the children have settled into school. I would like to officially welcome our new EYFS children and their families to Burrsville! It has been great meeting you on the gate and I look forward to getting to know you all a little better over the coming weeks. The children are settling in well and are learning their new routines. I am sure they have been very tired this week as there is so much to take in during these early days. I know the EYFS staff are looking like they are ready for the weekend!

Hopefully you will have now received your year 1 and 2 'Meet the Teacher' videos. We were having a few technical difficulties with the year 2 presentation but that should be working now. If you have not been receiving letters and information emailed to you by the school, please check your clutter and junk boxes. If they are not there, please contact the school office to check we have your correct information. As I mentioned last week, we are trying to go paperless as much as we possibly can. Other ways you can find information about the school include using the school website and joining our private Facebook page. It is called, 'Burrsville Infant Academy (official school page)' and you will be asked to answer a few questions before we accept you as a member. Although the page is not manned full time, we use it to share information with you and post reminders. For any urgent queries or specific information regarding your child, please phone the school office. Thank you.

Thank you for all your support adhering to our new safety procedures. It's lovely so see that everyone is keen to be on time for school, but please remember you have the full 15 minutes to bring your child into and collect from school. This will help us all to follow the social distancing rules.

Sadly, I have had a few complaints this week from parents regarding anti-social behaviour outside school, including use of abusive language and parents smoking and vaping right outside the school gates. Please be mindful that we are an infant school and we have a nursery attached. Using foul language and aggressive behaviour outside the school is not the behaviour we want to teach our children and is completely inappropriate outside the school. It would also be greatly appreciated if you could not smoke and vape right outside the school gates where our young children are walking. Thank you for your support with this.

Just a couple of reminders:

- Please do not use mobile phones on the school site.
- Remember to cut **strawberries and grapes** into **quarters** to prevent risk of choking.
- Burrsville is a <u>nut free zone</u> please remember this when preparing your child's lunchbox.
- Hoop earrings are not permitted stud earrings only, which must be removed for PE.

A reminder of the government guidelines:

Schools should ask parents and staff to inform them immediately of the results of a test:

- if someone tests negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating. They could still have another virus, such as a cold or flu in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of their household can stop self-isolating.
- if someone tests positive, they should follow the <u>'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection'</u> and must continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 10-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 14 days.
