On-line safety

I would just like to make all parents and carers aware of a couple of online safeguarding concerns that have come to my attention this week.

This week a parent has shared that her child has been very upset by a video with 'Huggy Wuggy' in it, this video encourages children to hurt their family members. Most of the 'Huggy Wuggy' videos and clips are not appropriate for young children and promote inappropriate behaviour. Please be mindful of this character and listen out for his name if your children are talking about him.

There has also been talk about the character 'Baldi' this week amongst the children, this character can often look as though he is an educational character but very often, he is violent and not appropriate for young children. Again, please be mindful of this, some children have been very upset by this character.

We encourage our children in school to tell an adult if they see something that frightens them when they are online, unfortunately children often will not tell an adult as they are worried they will not be able to play.
